Gas can exchange for Porter County residents at Hebron collection event

Hebron, Indiana – Porter County residents will be able to exchange their old gas cans for environmentally friendly 2.5-gallon gas cans at the household hazardous waste collection event from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 15, at Hebron Middle School, 307 South Main St.

Limit one can exchange per vehicle while supplies last. Gas cans are provided compliments of Northwest Indiana Clean Air.

Sponsored by the Recycling & Waste Reduction District of Porter County, the household hazardous waste collection event will help Porter County residents safely dispose of their old pesticides, gasoline, CFLs and other products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable or reactive ingredients.

Only household hazardous waste will be accepted at this event, including aerosol cans; anti-freeze; oil; batteries (household and automotive); corrosives; medications; mercury containing products (fluorescent tubes, CFLs, thermometers, thermostats, etc.); oil-based and latex paint, thinners and solvents; pesticides and other poisons; diesel fuel, kerosene, other flammable liquids; and ammunition. Large waste oil containers will be evacuated after 1:30 p.m.

Items that will not be accepted at this event include: explosives, asbestos, grill propane cylinders, commercial hazardous waste, containers larger than 30 gallons with products other than oil, controlled substances, and radioactive materials, such as smoke detectors.

The last household hazardous waste collection event is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 17 at Porter County Expo Center, 215 E. Division Rd., Valparaiso.

There are alternate locations that accept medications, fluorescent light bulbs, latex paint and household batteries on a continuous basis, so residents can properly dispose of these products at their convenience.

Unused medications are accepted at the following law enforcement agencies: Porter Police Department, 50 Francis St.; Valparaiso Police Department, 355 S. Washington St.; Chesterton Police Department, 790 Broadway; Portage, 2693 Irving St.; Porter County Sheriff's Department, 2755 S. Ind. 49, and Hebron Police Department, 106 East Sigler St.

Household batteries can be recycled at a number of places throughout Porter County. Visit the district website www.ItMeansTheWorld.org for a complete listing.

Fluorescent tube lights and compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) can be recycled at either the Porter County public compost site: Valparaiso, 2150 W. Lincolnway, Mondays through Fridays, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.; Saturdays, 9 a.m.-4 p.m.; or Boone Grove, 546 S. 400 W., Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, noon-5 p.m.; Saturdays, 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

The City of Hobart accepts latex paint donations from Porter County residents at its Department of Public Works site, 340 S. Shelby St., Mondays through Fridays, between 7 a.m. and 2:45 p.m.; and Saturdays, between 8 and 11:45 a.m.
